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
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National Webinar on the occasion of World Philosophy Day


Introduction of speakers- Prof. Nandini Sinha Kapur

Philosophy Programme Coordinator Prof. Nandini Sinha Kapur introduced the speakers and highlighted the contributions of distinguished speakers of the webinar. She highlighted the significance, importance and objectives of today's webinar.



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Guest of Honour- Prof. Ramesh Chandra Sinha

In this occasion, two eminent philosophers, Prof. Ramesh Chandra Sinha, Former Chairman Indian Council of Philosophical Research as a guest of honour and Prof. Mrinal Miri, *Padma Bhushan* and Former Vice Chancellor, NEHU Shilong, as a key-note speaker were present.

Guest of Honour Prof. Ramesh Chandra Sinha, talked about philosophizing in the contemporary world. He said that post-modern society can be characterized as the age of technology and endism. He argued that this endism is very much against to the nature of human being. Human has compassion towards other. He highlighted the significance of Compassion in the post-modern society. Compassion means to suffer with others. Compassion is composed of with empathy and sympathy. Empathy is required for feeling towards others. He concluded that the 'new normal' emerged from our present crisis. He said that without any stigma we should be compassionate towards our fellow being and all living beings. He emphasized self-realized persons (*Bodhisattva* or *Sthitpragya*) can serve the society in multiple ways

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Key-note speaker- Prof. Mrinal Miri


Key-note speaker Prof. Mrinal Miri began his lecture with the premise that moral philosophy in the West has two basic sources: religion and Enlightenment. He highlighted that these two sources seem fundamentally different, but have something very important in common, namely, that man is absolutely unique among all earthly creatures and the root of this uniqueness is man's possession of reason which enables man to distinguish between right and wrong and good and bad. He argued that a little manipulation of the idea of reason which the two sources have in common can be shown to lead to views which are morally repugnant. He claimed dharmic conception of the world and of humans can be the source of starkly different ethical views. The concept of dharma represents Indian ethical view. Dharma is context-sensitive. After discussing the nature of dharma with the help of various sources, he discussed Gandhi's ethical thought which is located firmly in the dharmic tradition. He concluded with the claim that Gandhi's ethical view is the most profound modern expression

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
